FRANKLIN, Mich. – What happens if your 16-year-old son is accused of rape for having sex with his 15-year-old girlfriend? What can you learn about estate planning from Michael Jackson and Frank Sinatra? Are you creating a potential break-in risk with your Facebook posts?

These tantalizing subjects and more are covered every week on Scott Weinberg's legal radio show, Weinberg on the Law, a production of CBS Radio's WXYT 1270 AM. It airs Sundays from 9-10 a.m.

"Today, practicing law is not just about court cases," says Weinberg, a 23-year veteran in the local legal sector, having practiced on both sides of the bench, as prosecutor and now defense attorney, in his career. "You have to create relationships with, and learn from, other lawyers, judges, politicians and local leaders so that you can be at the top of your game."

That's what Weinberg's doing with the radio show, which started airing in March. Thus far, he's interviewed Channel 4 crime reporter Paula Tutman, famed attorney Geoffrey Fieger, Oakland County Sheriff Michael Bouchard, Oakland County Executive L. Brooks Patterson, Wayne County Prosecutor Kym Worthy and NPR Journalist Celeste Headlee – among dozens of others.

"In two decades of practicing law, I've seen and heard just about everything," says Weinberg, who is managing partner of the Weinberg Law Firm in Franklin. The firm serves clients throughout the state of Michigan. "It's an honor to be able to offer what I've learned to keep others safe and out of jail."

Weinberg manages a dozen attorneys in defending clients on a variety of criminal offenses. Before he founded Michigan Criminal Lawyers PC in 1997 (which now operates under the name Weinberg Law), he worked with Bill Bufalino for 10 years and before that, was a prosecutor in Macomb County.

He has been an expert guest commentator on Court TV, WWJ and WXYT radio for noted cases like People v. Jack Kevorkian, the Jenny Jones murder case, Dr. People v. Donald Debolt and People v. Watts. He is also a regular radio guest on WXYT, WWJ and WJR.

Weinberg is a graduate of University of Michigan and University of Detroit School of Law and a member of the Michigan and Illinois State Bar Associations.
